

THE TROUBLE WITH PRIMITIVE FORMS OF COMMUNICATION

In human society, writing is the most precise misrepresentation of civilized language that is known. The written word is a terribly inaccurate recording of verbal communication between humans, and to further complicate things, verbal communication is a terribly inaccurate representation of human thought.

To transmit one's thoughts directly to another being who utilizes a primitive form of communication known as "spoken language," such as a human, you must take the thoughts in your head and turn them into abstract combinations of letters that direct the tongue, lips, and jaw to perform a combination of movements in order to create a sound that indicates a "word." Combinations of words create single representations of a thought, known as "sentences." A sentence is what a judge decrees as your punishment when you have broken the "law."

Laws are written ideas that tell people what they can do and what they cannot do. Because no one understands them, an entire profession is dedicated to misinterpreting the thoughts these laws represent. These individuals are called "lawyers." Civilized humans, knowing they cannot possibly comprehend the true meaning of the written word, rely on lawyers, selfless individuals who

collectively work for the common good, to decide what the meaning of "is" is.

Because languages require a large number of words in order for one to effectively convey ideas while using them, several large groups of humans have taken it upon themselves to collect these words in a large book called a "dictionary." A dictionary tells the users of a certain language what words they can use. If a word you utter isn't in these dictionaries, it will be impossible for anyone to understand you, which will put you in a terrible confudgery.
